MEETINGS

On the first Wednesday of each month, the committee meets at various locations around the State to discuss future committee projects, on-goings in our individual labs, tribulations reported from outside labs, and the latest news in the laboratory community. Occasionally, meetings are followed by a one-hour presentation that that shall offer one CEU for attendance.

SEMINARS

The committee orchestrates a minimum of one seminar per year that is aimed directly at assisting laboratory personnel. The seminar is usually held in the fall or the spring and may range from a half-day seminar to a full-day seminar. On occasion, the seminar will be held jointly with another committee of the IWEA.

• IWEA ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The committee orchestrates the laboratory session of the IWEA Annual conference. This session typically takes place the morning before the Awards Luncheon.

WASTEWATER CHALLENGE

The committee orchestrates the laboratory session of the Operators' Challenge. This part of the Challenge is aimed at teaching QA/QC parameters, introducing new lab equipment and procedures, enhancing operator technique, and evaluating operator knowledge of lab analyses.

The audits serve as an excellent tool for hands-on consulting in your actual laboratory. Labs that score well are awarded with the IWEA Laboratory Excellence Award.

OUR INFLUENCE

The committee works with State and Federal government to represent you! We have developed the Quality Assurance Manual for Indiana Wastewater Laboratories and helped to construct a number of standardized bench sheets that are IDEM-approved and available for use in any Indiana wastewater lab. We also review the proposed updates to 40 CFR Part 136 and formally object to any method updates that we feel may negatively impact our capability to reasonably produce quality results.
